- 1) Applications will be accepted from any graduating high school Senior planning to study in an accredited four-year college or two-year college and who is the child or grandchild of a Sportsman Club or Ikes member with at least one year membership and who lives within 50 miles of West Point.
- 2) The applicant must have a minimum GPA of 2.75.
- 3) Applicants must be in good standing with their respective school.
- 4) This scholarship will be in the amount of up to \$500.00 on a one-time basis.
- 5) All applications should be filled out completely. Incomplete applications will not be considered.
- 6) Scholarship payment will be issued at the start of second semester upon receipt of transcript.
- 7) Applicants must have three (3) references: 1) a school teacher, 2) a personal reference who is not a relative, and 3) a person who you have had an outdoor experience with.
- 8) Final selection will be made by the West Point Sportsman Club Scholarship Committee.
- 9) All applications must be received no later than April 1st.
